EXECUTIVE MBA RESIDENCIES

Orientation Residency – The Executive MBA experience begins April 11, 2010, with GO! Week, a weeklong residency at the Charles F. Knight Executive Education and Conference Center on the Washington University campus. This is an intensive introduction to the curriculum, your classmates, and the Olin community – and a deeply personal, memorable experience. During this required weeklong, live-in stay, you will meet your study team, commit to personal and team goals, and engage in a number of rigorous academic exercises designed to lay the groundwork for the 20-month journey through the program.

Leadership Residency – Leadership requires the capacity to manage a variety of relationships up and down the hierarchy, within and across organizational groups, and inside and outside of the organization in order to accomplish goals. Offered with the Executive MBA monthly format, this week-long live-in residency at the Knight Center, beginning March 13, 2011, helps you better understand executive leadership and relationships between and among executives, boards of directors, shareholders and other stakeholders.

International Management Residency – This required International Residency offers a unique opportunity to study international business in the world's leading fastest-growing business center. Travel to Shanghai to study global markets, observe the cultural differences in business practices, and learn more about the challenges faced by international corporations. The residency gives you the opportunity to interact with students and alumni of the Washington University-Fudan University Executive MBA Program. In addition, you meet with executives at foreign-owned companies, joint venture operations between the United States and Chinese firms, and multinational corporations that compete in the region. The educational component of this residency is included in program tuition. Students are responsible for travel and lodging expenses.

TUITION

Cost for the 20-month program for students entering Class 36 in April 2010 is \$93,600. Meals, textbooks, tutoring assistance, study materials, on-campus parking and lodging for both Go! Week and the Leadership Residency at the Knight Center are included in the tuition. Airfare and lodging costs for the international trip, which takes place in October 2011, are the responsibility of each student. Although not required, for students who wish to stay on campus at the Knight Center during regular class weekends, lodging packages are available at a discounted rate.

Upon receiving an offer of admission into the Executive MBA Program, students must submit a \$2,500 nonrefundable deposit to secure a place in the class. Tuition is payable in five equal installments of \$18,720 and the first invoice will be issued in April 2010. The deposit will be applied to the first tuition installment. EMBA students may be eligible for non-need based student loans. Additional financial aid information is available on our website at www.olin.wustl.edu/emba.

As an added benefit and to reinforce Olin's commitment to life-long learning, our students and alumni are invited to enroll in full-time MBA or PMBA courses tuition-free. This continuing education benefit is offered on a space-available basis and is in effect during the EMBA program and for two years following. After two years, EMBA alumni will receive a 50% discount on the cost of PMBA tuition.

THE CHARLES F. KNIGHT EXECUTIVE EDUCATION AND CONFERENCE CENTER

Located on the campus of Washington University in St. Louis, the Knight Center is Olin Business School's residential learning facility and offers an environment that stimulates both creative and strategic thinking. Conference and classrooms are equipped with state-of-the-art technology and accommodations that include 66 guest rooms. Added amenities include an on-site fitness center, dining areas that provide beautifully prepared meals, and the EMBA Alumni Pub.
